

Market Value of Production

\$21,057,000 in 2002, \$25,272,000 in 1997, down 17 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$10,639,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$10,418,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$23,712 in 2002, \$28,206 in 1997, down 16 percent.


Government Payments
