


2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile



Lawrence, Kentucky

Number of farms

318 farms in 2002, 334 farms in 1997, down 5 percent.

Land in farms

57,021 acres in 2002, 52,639 acres in 1997, up 8 percent.

Average size of farm

179 acres in 2002, 158 acres in 1997, up 13 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$1,792,000 in 2002, \$2,165,000 in 1997, down 17 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$1,039,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$753,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$5,636 in 2002, \$6,482 in 1997, down 13 percent.


Government Payments
