


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**



## Lee, Kentucky

#### **Number of farms**

173 farms in 2002, 179 farms in 1997, down 3 percent.

#### Land in farms

23,450 acres in 2002, 24,817 acres in 1997, down 6 percent.

### Average size of farm

136 acres in 2002, 139 acres in 1997, down 2 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$1,150,000 in 2002, \$1,755,000 in 1997, down 34 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$622,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$528,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$6,650 in 2002, \$9,802 in 1997, down 32 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
