

# Lewis, Kentucky

## **Number of farms**

196 acres in 2002, 176 acres in 1997, up 11 percent.

# **Market Value of Production**

\$9,493,000 in 2002, \$14,124,000 in 1997, down 33 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$5,640,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$3,853,000 of the total value in 2002.

# Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$12,951 in 2002, \$17,100 in 1997, down 24 percent.


### **Government Payments**
