


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**



## Lincoln, Kentucky

#### **Number of farms**

1,275 farms in 2002, 1,375 farms in 1997, down 7 percent.

#### Land in farms

171,276 acres in 2002, 174,062 acres in 1997, down 2 percent.

#### Average size of farm

134 acres in 2002, 127 acres in 1997, up 6 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$35,077,000 in 2002, \$38,587,000 in 1997, down 9 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$11,468,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$23,610,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$27,512 in 2002, \$28,063 in 1997, down 2 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
