

Livingston, Kentucky

Number of farms

518 farms in 2002, 468 farms in 1997, up 11 percent.

Land in farms

145,822 acres in 2002, 124,650 acres in 1997, up 17 percent.

Average size of farm

282 acres in 2002, 266 acres in 1997, up 6 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$11,310,000 in 2002, \$10,252,000 in 1997, up 10 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$3,810,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$7,500,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$21,834 in 2002, \$21,906 in 1997, down slightly.


Government Payments
