

# Boone, Kentucky

#### **Number of farms**

743 farms in 2002, 783 farms in 1997, down 5 percent.

#### Land in farms

74,915 acres in 2002, 83,258 acres in 1997, down 10 percent.

#### Average size of farm

101 acres in 2002, 106 acres in 1997, down 5 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$18,148,000 in 2002, \$16,079,000 in 1997, up 13 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$11,305,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$6,843,000 of the total value in 2002.

# Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$24,426 in 2002, \$20,535 in 1997, up 19 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
