\$55,632,000 in 2002, \$66,206,000 in 1997, down 16 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$38,329,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$17,302,000 of the total value in 2002.

## Market Value of Production, average per farm




