


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**



## McCracken, Kentucky

#### **Number of farms**

531 farms in 2002, 536 farms in 1997, down 1 percent.

#### Land in farms

85,459 acres in 2002, 72,837 acres in 1997, up 17 percent.

#### Average size of farm

161 acres in 2002, 136 acres in 1997, up 18 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$15,812,000 in 2002, \$17,315,000 in 1997, down 9 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$11,646,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$4,166,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$29,777 in 2002, \$32,305 in 1997, down 8 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
