## McLean, Kentucky

### Number of farms

413 farms in 2002, 477 farms in 1997, down 13 percent.

### Land in farms

128,912 acres in 2002, 143,952 acres in 1997, down 10 percent.

### Average size of farm

312 acres in 2002, 302 acres in 1997, up 3 percent.

### **Market Value of Production**

\$64,765,000 in 2002, \$57,957,000 in 1997, up 12 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$20,730,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$44,034,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm




