

Market Value of Production

\$22,354,000 in 2002, \$30,395,000 in 1997, down 26 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$9,543,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$12,812,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$30,791 in 2002, \$38,868 in 1997, down 21 percent.


Government Payments
