

# **Number of farms**

134,771 acres in 2002, 129,046 acres in 1997, up 4 percent.

## Average size of farm

141 acres in 2002, 134 acres in 1997, up 5 percent.

### **Market Value of Production**

\$16,171,000 in 2002, \$19,480,000 in 1997, down 17 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$6,876,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$9,295,000 of the total value in 2002.

# Market Value of Production, average per farm




## **Government Payments**
