

131,990 acres in 2002, 135,364 acres in 1997, down 2 percent.

Average size of farm

139 acres in 2002, 133 acres in 1997, up 5 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$29,782,000 in 2002, \$25,312,000 in 1997, up 18 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$5,886,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$23,895,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$31,349 in 2002, \$24,865 in 1997, up 26 percent.


Government Payments
