


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**



## Montgomery, Kentucky

#### **Number of farms**

676 farms in 2002, 781 farms in 1997, down 13 percent.

#### Land in farms

90,951 acres in 2002, 110,479 acres in 1997, down 18 percent.

#### Average size of farm

135 acres in 2002, 141 acres in 1997, down 4 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$15,647,000 in 2002, \$22,088,000 in 1997, down 29 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$5,135,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$10,512,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$23,146 in 2002, \$28,282 in 1997, down 18 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
