

Morgan, Kentucky

Number of farms

804 farms in 2002, 754 farms in 1997, up 7 percent.

Land in farms

115,559 acres in 2002, 114,744 acres in 1997, up 1 percent.

Average size of farm

144 acres in 2002, 152 acres in 1997, down 5 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$7,642,000 in 2002, \$9,727,000 in 1997, down 21 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$4,194,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$3,449,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$9,505 in 2002, \$12,900 in 1997, down 26 percent.


Government Payments
