

33,512 acres in 2002, 29,318 acres in 1997, up 14 percent.

122 acres in 2002, 117 acres in 1997, up 4 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$1,258,000 in 2002, \$2,585,000 in 1997, down 51 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$440,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$818,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$4,591 in 2002, \$10,300 in 1997, down 55 percent.


Government Payments
