

Nicholas, Kentucky

Number of farms

Land in farms

105,524 acres in 2002, 106,012 acres in 1997, down slightly.

Average size of farm

181 acres in 2002, 176 acres in 1997, up 3 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$11,875,000 in 2002, \$15,626,000 in 1997, down 24 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$6,106,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$5,769,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$20,404 in 2002, \$25,957 in 1997, down 21 percent.


Government Payments
