

Number of farms

1,006 farms in 2002, 1,080 farms in 1997, down 7 percent.

Land in farms

167,077 acres in 2002, 177,085 acres in 1997, down 6 percent.

Average size of farm

166 acres in 2002, 164 acres in 1997, up 1 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$61,454,000 in 2002, \$45,081,000 in 1997, up 36 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$11,397,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$50,056,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$61,087 in 2002, \$41,742 in 1997, up 46 percent.


Government Payments
