\$21,267,000 in 2002, \$16,778,000 in 1997, up 27 percent.Crop sales accounted for \$8,957,000 of the total value in 2002.Livestock sales accounted for \$12,310,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm




