


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**



## Owsley, Kentucky

#### **Number of farms**

227 farms in 2002, 260 farms in 1997, down 13 percent.

#### Land in farms

32,996 acres in 2002, 31,588 acres in 1997, up 4 percent.

#### Average size of farm

145 acres in 2002, 121 acres in 1997, up 20 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$1,710,000 in 2002, \$2,769,000 in 1997, down 38 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$1,420,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$289,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$7,531 in 2002, \$10,649 in 1997, down 29 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
