## Pendleton, Kentucky

**Number of farms** 964 farms in 2002, 911 farms in 1997, up 6 percent.

Land in farms 132,402 acres in 2002, 123,789 acres in 1997, up 7 percent.

## **Market Value of Production**

\$8,801,000 in 2002, \$14,839,000 in 1997, down 41 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$5,437,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$3,365,000 of the total value in 2002.

## Market Value of Production, average per farm




