


2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile



Pulaski, Kentucky

Number of farms

1,977 farms in 2002, 2,165 farms in 1997, down 9 percent.

Land in farms

232,129 acres in 2002, 226,387 acres in 1997, up 3 percent.

Average size of farm

117 acres in 2002, 105 acres in 1997, up 11 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$35,018,000 in 2002, \$36,572,000 in 1997, down 4 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$12,412,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$22,605,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$17,712 in 2002, \$16,893 in 1997, up 5 percent.


Government Payments
