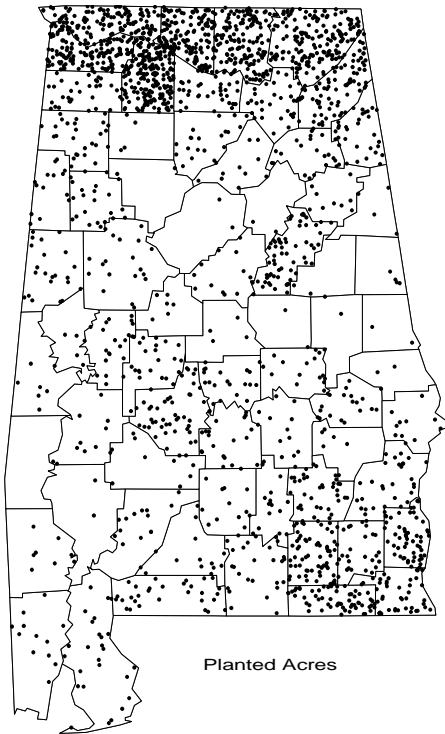

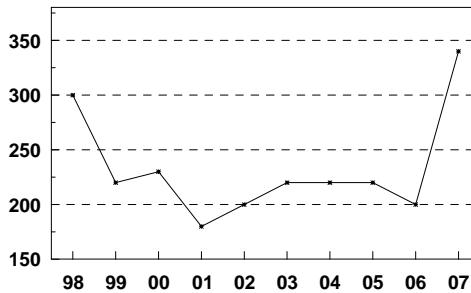

Madison county topped all other Alabama counties in corn production for 2007 with 2,244,000 bushels. The 21,300 acres harvested by the county's producers averaged 105 bushels per acre. This was 26 bushels above the state average.

Other top producing counties for the year were: Limestone, Lawrence, Jackson, and Colbert.

Alabama corn producers harvested a total of 280,000 acres in 2007. Yield per acre was 79 bushels. Production totaled 22.1 million bushels and was valued at \$86.3 million.

Alabama ranked 30th in the United States in corn grain production. Iowa, Illinois, Nebraska, Minnesota, and Indiana were the leading states.
