Crawford County is a county located in the state of Illinois. Its county seat is Robinson, Illinois.

Crawford County was formed in 1816 out of Edwards County. At the time of its formation, it encompassed about one fourth of the State, but it was reduced to its present borders by 1831. It was named in honor of William H. Crawford, who was serving as Secretary of War and Secretary of the Treasury at the time.

Crawford Co Geography

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, the county has a total area of 1,154 km (446 mi). 1,149 km (444 mi) of it is land and 6 km (2 mi) of it is water. The total area is 0.49% water.
