Edwards County was named for Ninian Edwards, the governor of the Illinois Territory, and, later, governor of Illinois.

When Edwards County was formed in 1815, it comprised nearly half of the State of Illinois. New counties were formed from it until, in 1824, it assumed its present form. Edwards County is now one of the smallest counties in Illinois.
