

Gallatin Co Information

Gallatin County is a county located in the State of Illinois. Its county seat is Shawneetown, Illinois.

The County was organized in 1812, having been formed from Randolph County. The County was named for Albert Gallatin, who was Secretary of the Treasury at the time.

Gallatin Co Geography

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, the county has a total area of 851 km (328 mi). 838 km (324 mi) of it is land and 12 km (5 mi) of it is water. The total area is 1.43% water.

The Wabash and Ohio rivers join in the northeastern part of the county. The Saline River is a major drainage in the county, and it feeds into the Ohio River.
