Kendall County was formed in 1841 out of LaSalle and Kane Counties. The county is named after Amos Kendall.

Kendall was the editor of the Frankfort, Kentucky newspaper, and went on to be an important advisor to President Andrew Jackson. Kendall became the U.S. Postmaster General in 1835.
