**Lawrence County** is a county located in the state of Illinois. Its county seat is Lawrenceville.

Lawrence County was formed in 1821 out of Crawford and Edwards Counties. It was named for Captain James Lawrence, killed in action in 1813 while in command of the frigate USS Chesapeake. Mortally wounded, he uttered the famous phrase "Don't give up the ship".

### Lawrence Co Geography

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, the county has a total area of 968 km (374 mi). 963 km (372 mi) of it is land and 5 km (2 mi) of it is water. The total area is 0.52% water.
