Lee County was formed in 1839 out of Ogle County. The County is named in honor of Lighthouse Harry Lee, officer in the Revolutionary War, or Richard Henry Lee, member of the Continental Congress. The Declaration of Independence was adopted pursuant to Lee's Resolution.
