Livingston County was formed from parts of McLean, LaSalle, and Iroquois counties. It was named after Edward Livingston, a prominent politician. He was the mayor of New York City, represented New York in the House of Representatives, and represented Louisiana in both houses of Congress. He was Andrew Jackson's Secretary of State.
