Massac Co Information

Massac County is a county located in the state of Illinois. Its county seat is Metropolis, Illinois.

Massac County was organized in 1843, out of Johnson and Pope Counties. The County was named for Fort Massac, which was built by the French in 1757, during the French and Indian War.

The Fort was itself named in 1759, in honor of Claud Louis d'Espinchal, Marquis de Massiac, the French Naval Minister. Massiac is located in France.

Massac Co Geography

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, the county has a total area of 627 km (242 mi). 619 km (239 mi) of it is land and 8 km (3 mi) of it is water. The total area is 1.26% water.
