McDonough County is named in honor of Thomas Macdonough who defeated a British squadron in the decisive naval Battle of Lake Champlain in the War of 1812. McDonough County was part of the "Military Tract" set aside by Congress for veterans of the War of 1812.

McDonough Co Geography

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, the county has a total area of 1,528 km (590 mi). 1,526 km (589 mi) of it is land and 2 km (1 mi) of it is water. The total area is 0.13% water.

The county has the unusual distinction of forming a forming a perfect square by Mercator map projection.
