Moultrie County is a county located in the state of Illinois. Its county seat is Sullivan, Illinois.

Moultrie County was formed in 1843 out of Shelby and Coles Counties. It is named for South Carolina General, and later Governor, William Moultrie. General Moultrie defended Sullivan's Island, South Carolina from British attack in 1776. The site was later renamed Fort Moultrie.

Moultrie Co Geography

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, the county has a total area of 892 km (344 mi). 869 km (336 mi) of it is land and 23 km (9 mi) of it is water. The total area is 2.57% water.
