Tazewell Co Information

Tazewell County is a county located in the state of Illinois. Its county seat is Pekin, Illinois.

Tazewell County was formed out of Peoria County in 1827. It was named in honor of Littleton Tazewell, who was serving in the U.S. Senate, and who became Governor of Virginia in 1834. It is, however, possible that it was named for Littleton's father, prominent Virginia politician Henry Tazewell, for whom Tazewell County, Virginia was named.

Tazewell Co Geography

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, the county has a total area of 1,704 km (658 mi). 1,681 km (649 mi) of it is land and 23 km (9 mi) of it is water. The total area is 1.37% water.
