Whiteside County is a county located in the state of Illinois. Its county seat is Morrison.

Whiteside County was formed in 1836 out of Jo Daviess and Henry Counties. It was named for General Samuel Whiteside, an Illinois officer in the War of 1812 and Black Hawk War.
