INDIANA'S HOG INVENTORY UP 4 PERCENT

According to the Indiana Field Office of USDA'S National Agricultural Statistics Service, Indiana producers had a total inventory of 3.50 million hogs and pigs on December 1, 2007, up 4 percent from a year earlier. Market hogs, at 3.17 million head, were 5 percent above last year. Breeding inventory, at 330,000 head, was unchanged from last year. Sows farrowed totaled 150,000 during the September - November 2007 quarter, up 7 percent from the same period a year earlier. Pig crop, at 1.34 million head, increased 8 percent from last year with a litter rate averaging 8.95, up 1 percent from a year ago. Indiana producers intend to farrow 150,000 sows during the December 2007 - February 2008 period, and 155,000 sows during the March - May 2008 period. If realized, farrowings during the December 2007 - February 2008 quarter would be up 10,000 (7 percent) and farrowings during the March - May 2008 quarter would be up 15,000 (11 percent) from the previous quarter.

U.S. inventory of all hogs and pigs on December 1, 2007 was 65.1 million head. This was up 4 percent from December 1, 2006, but down 1 percent from September 1, 2007. Breeding inventory, at 6.16 million head, was up 1 percent from last year and up slightly from the previous quarter. Market hog inventory, at 59.0 million head, was up 5 percent from last year, but down 1 percent from last quarter. The September - November 2007 U.S. pig crop at 28.0 million head, was up 4 percent from 2006 and up 7 percent from 2005. Sows farrowing during this period totaled 3.03 million head, up 3 percent from 2006 and up 4 percent from 2005. The sows farrowed during this quarter represented 49 percent of the breeding herd. The average pigs saved per litter was 9.24 for the September - November 2007 period, compared to 9.11 pigs last year. Pigs saved per litter by size of operation ranged from 7.40 for operations with 1-99 hogs to 9.30 for operations with more than 5,000 hogs and pigs.

U.S. hog producers intend to have 2.98 million sows farrow during the December 2007 - February 2008 quarter, up 2 percent from the actual farrowings during the same period in 2007, and up 5 percent from 2006. Intended farrowings for March - May 2008, at 3.04 million sows, are up slightly from 2007 and up 4 percent from 2006.
