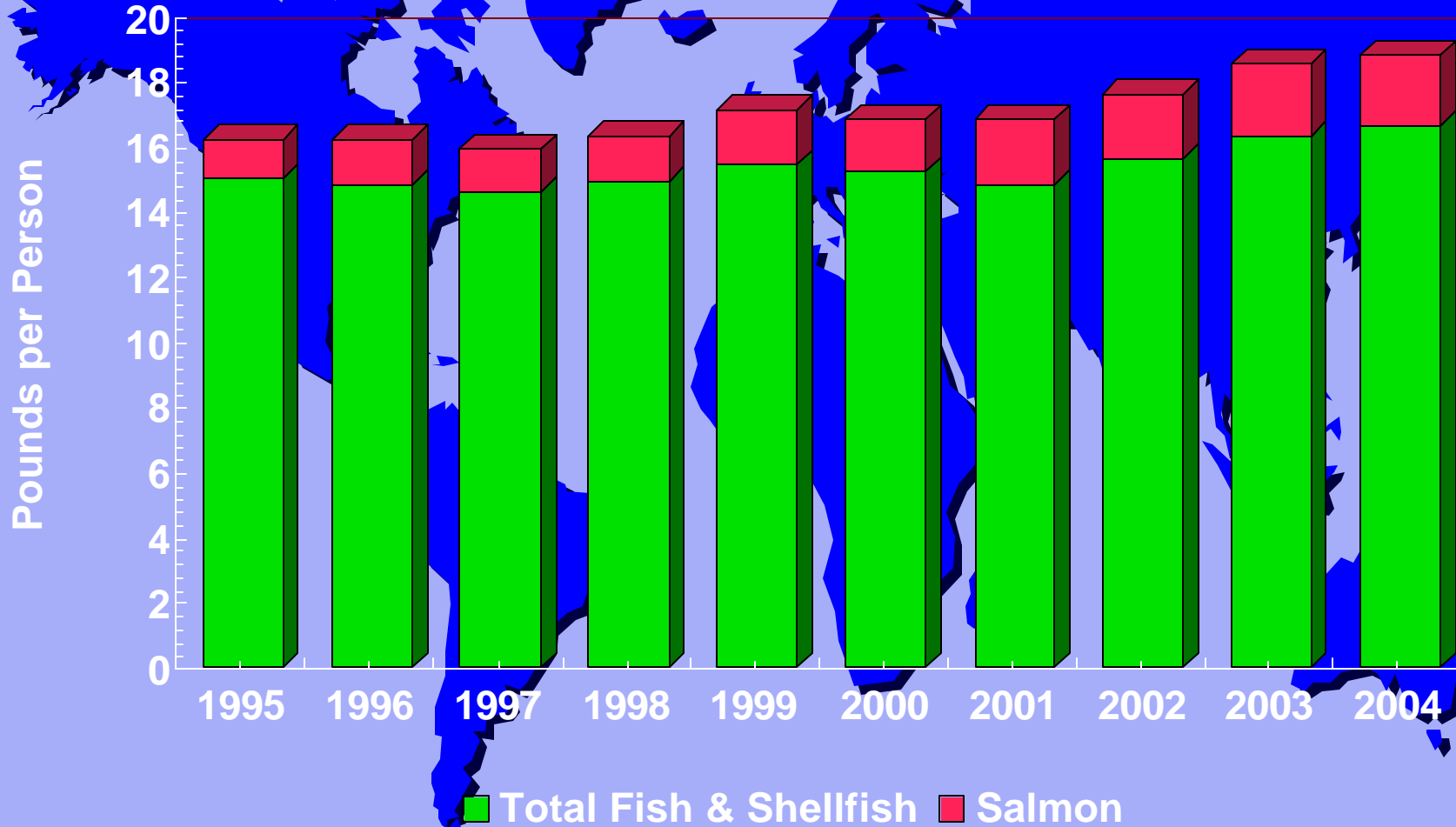

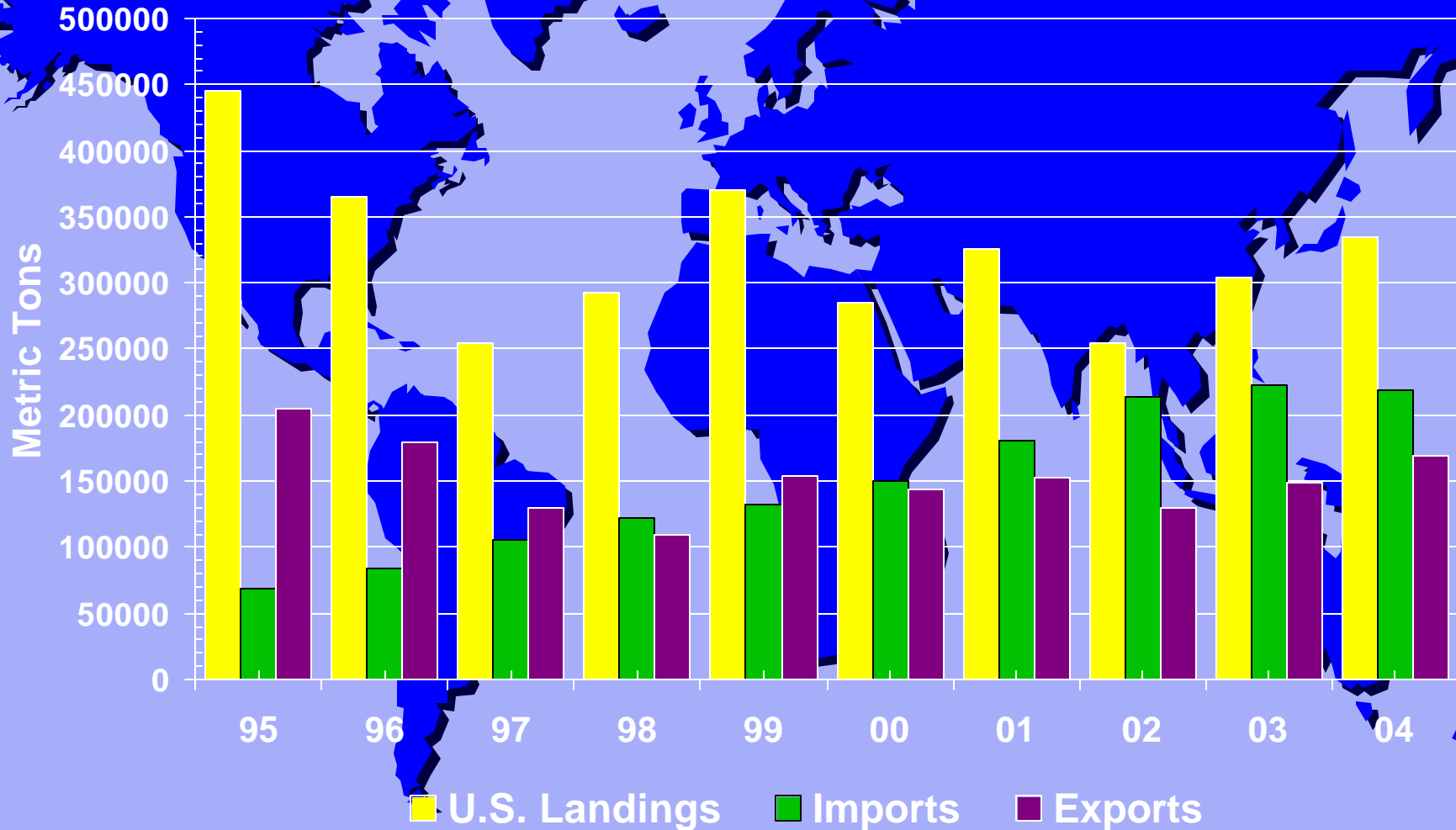


U.S. Consumption of Salmon Has Increased Overall and as a Share of Rising Fish & Shellfish Consumption *



* *Salmon's share grew from 7.9 % to 13 % from 1995 to 2004.*

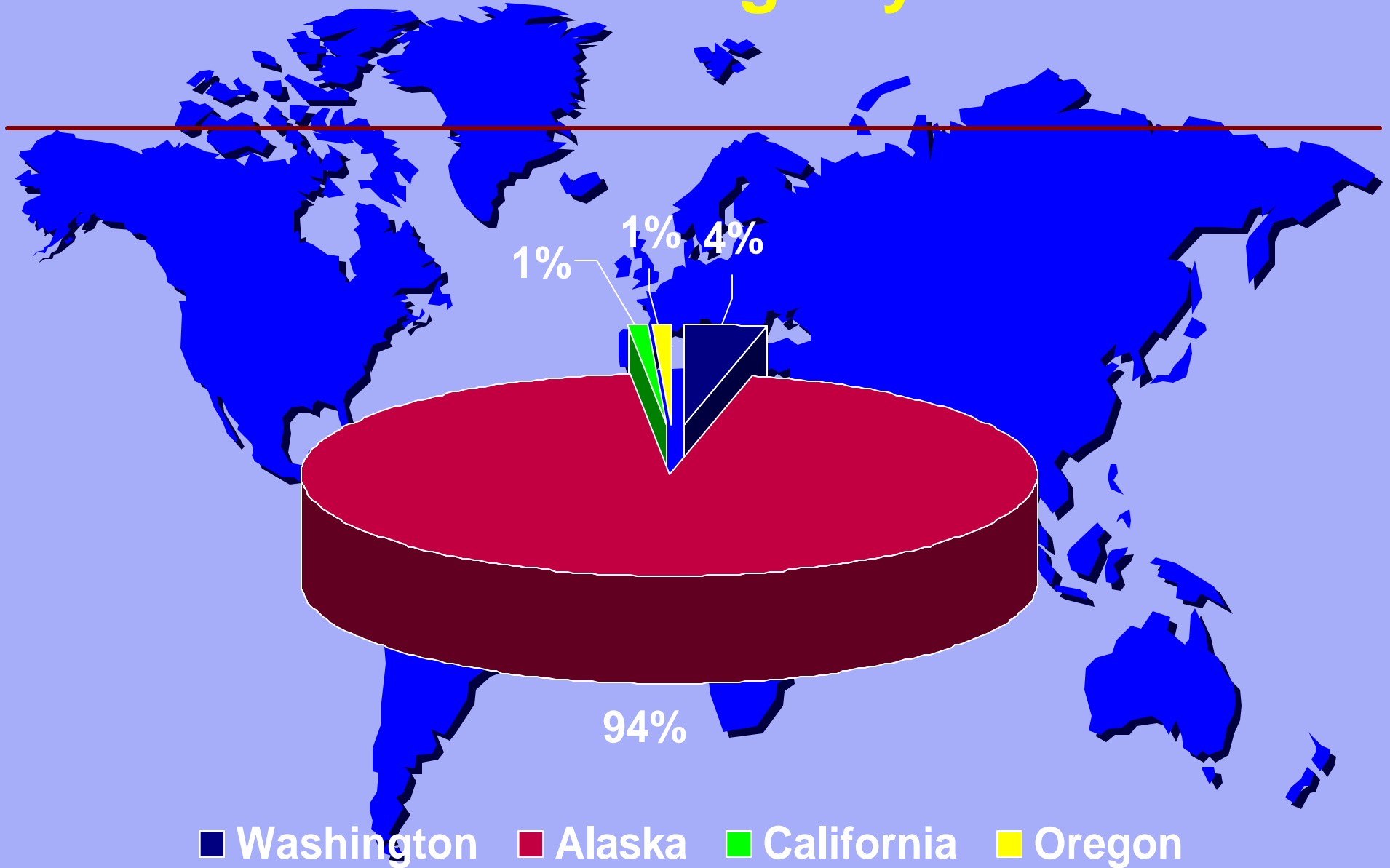
U.S. Landings, Imports and Exports of Salmon



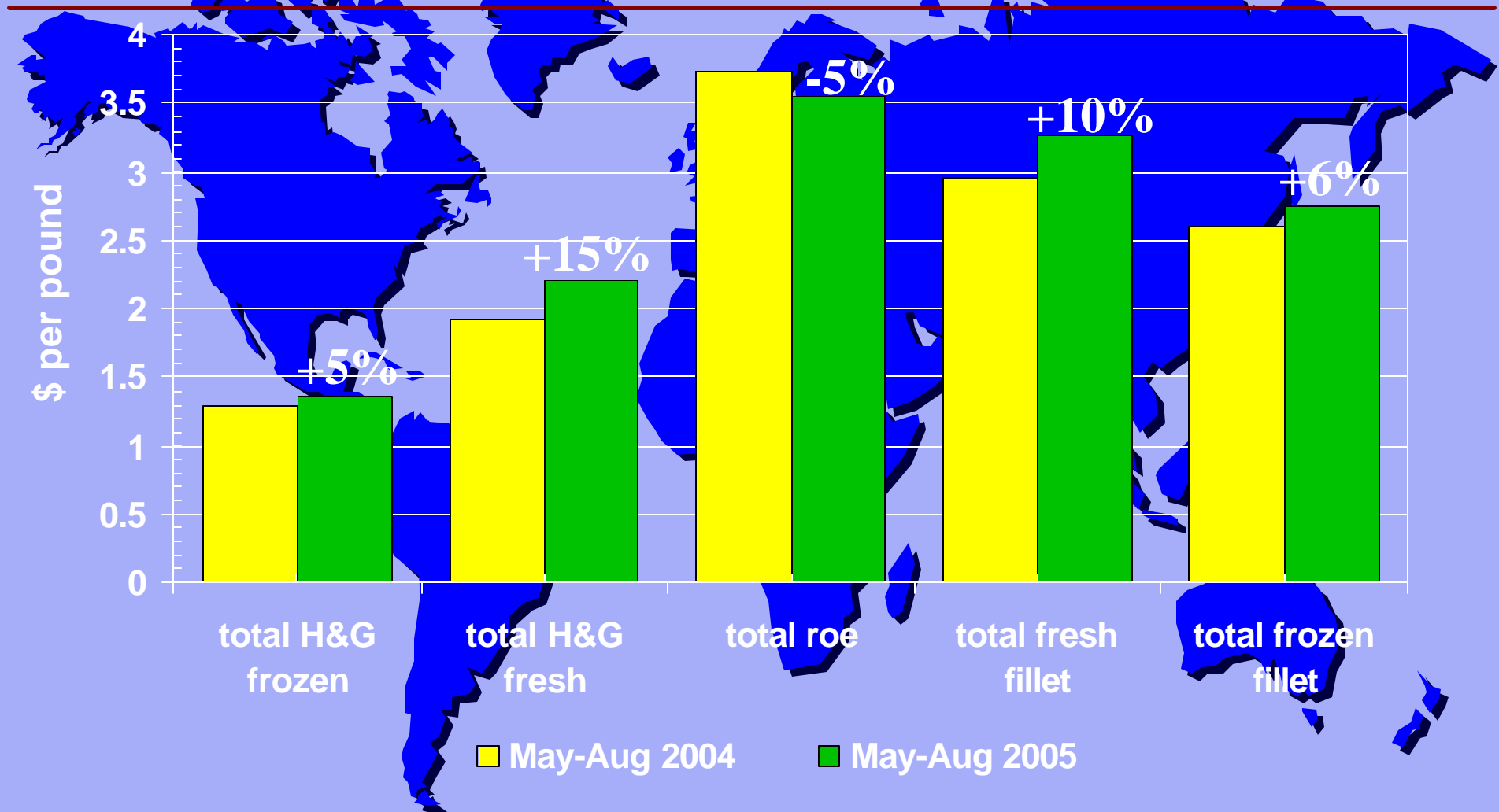

H&G denotes Headed & Gutted.

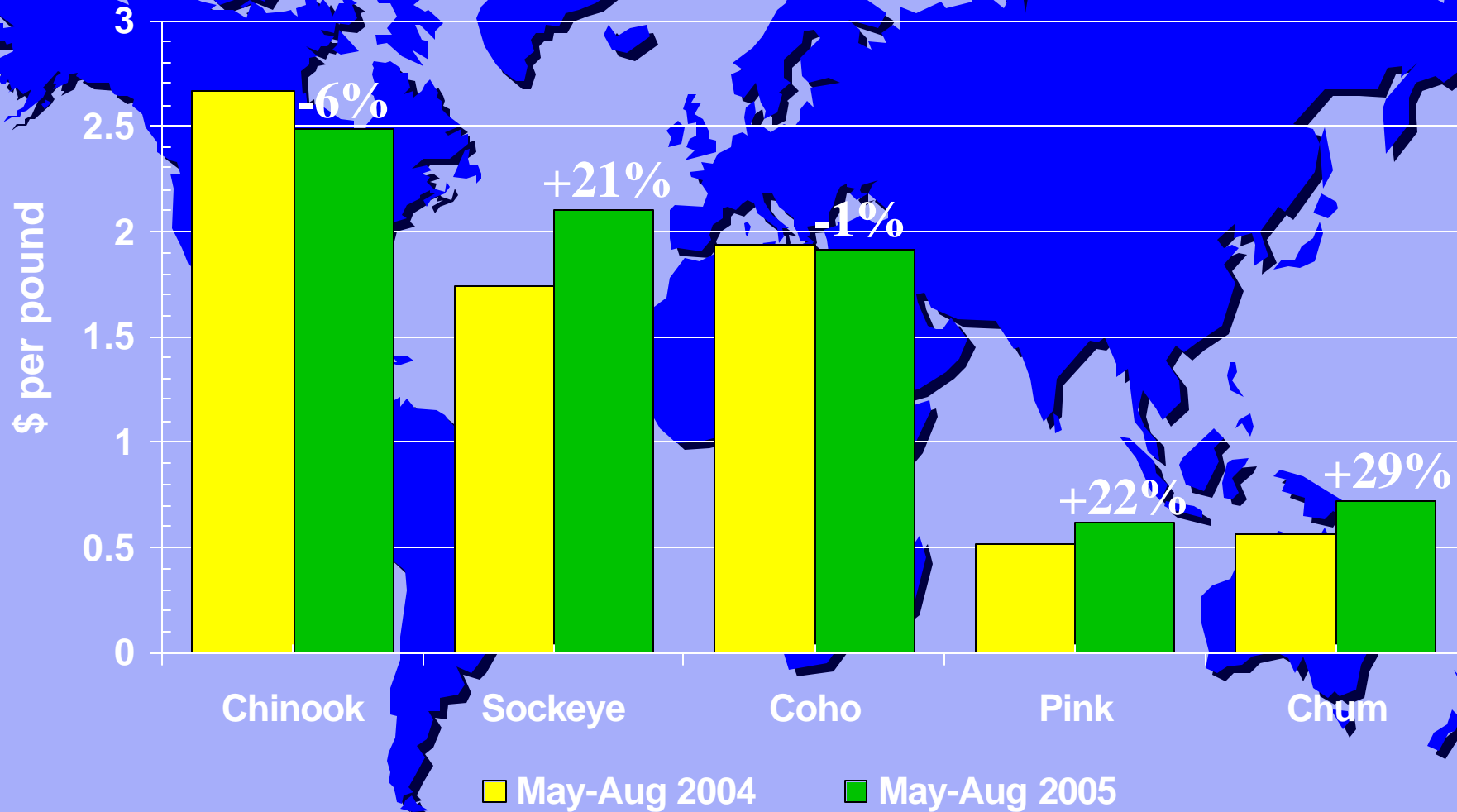

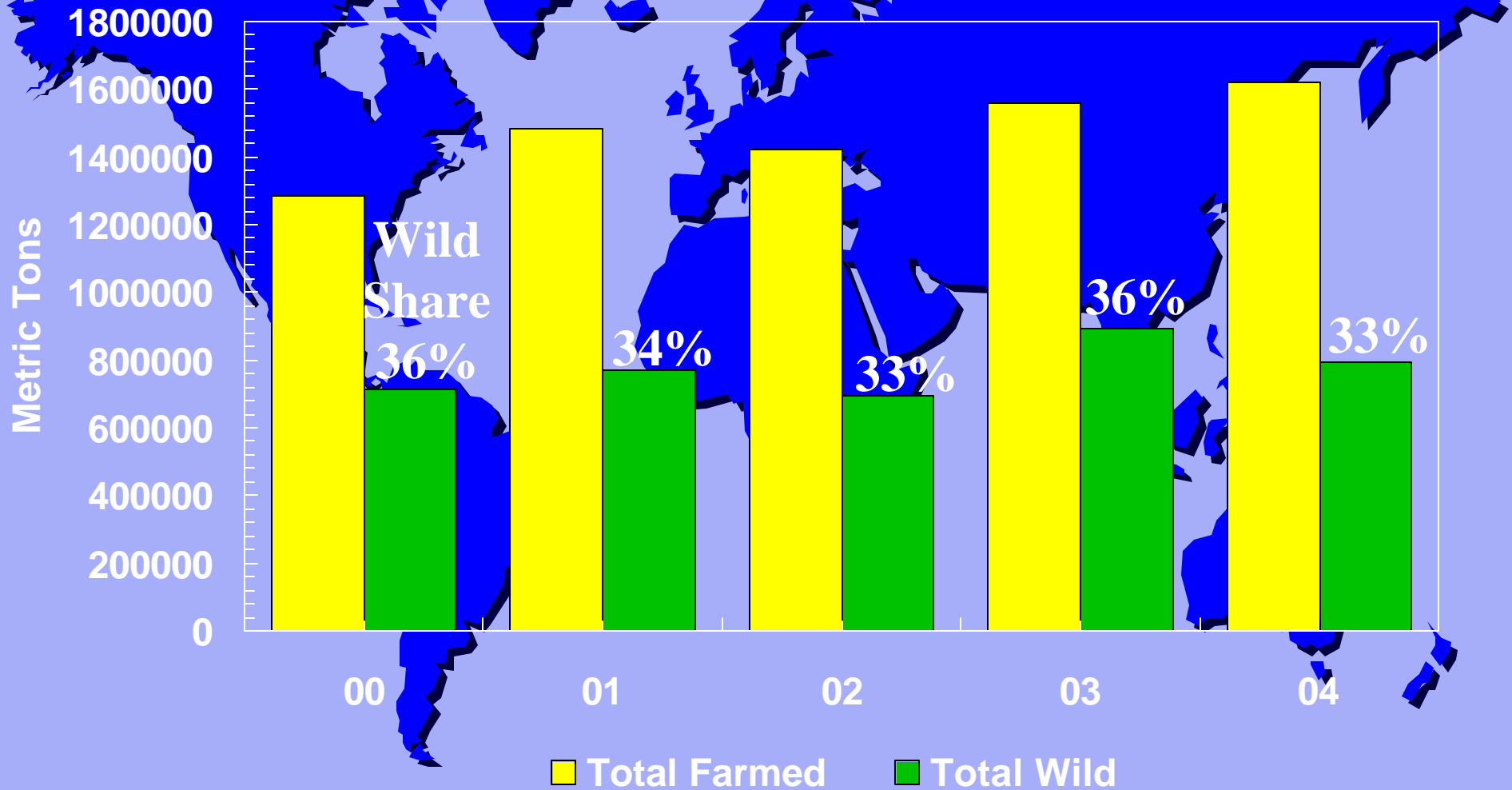
Alaska H&G Frozen Salmon Wholesale Prices by Species during May-August 2004 & 2005

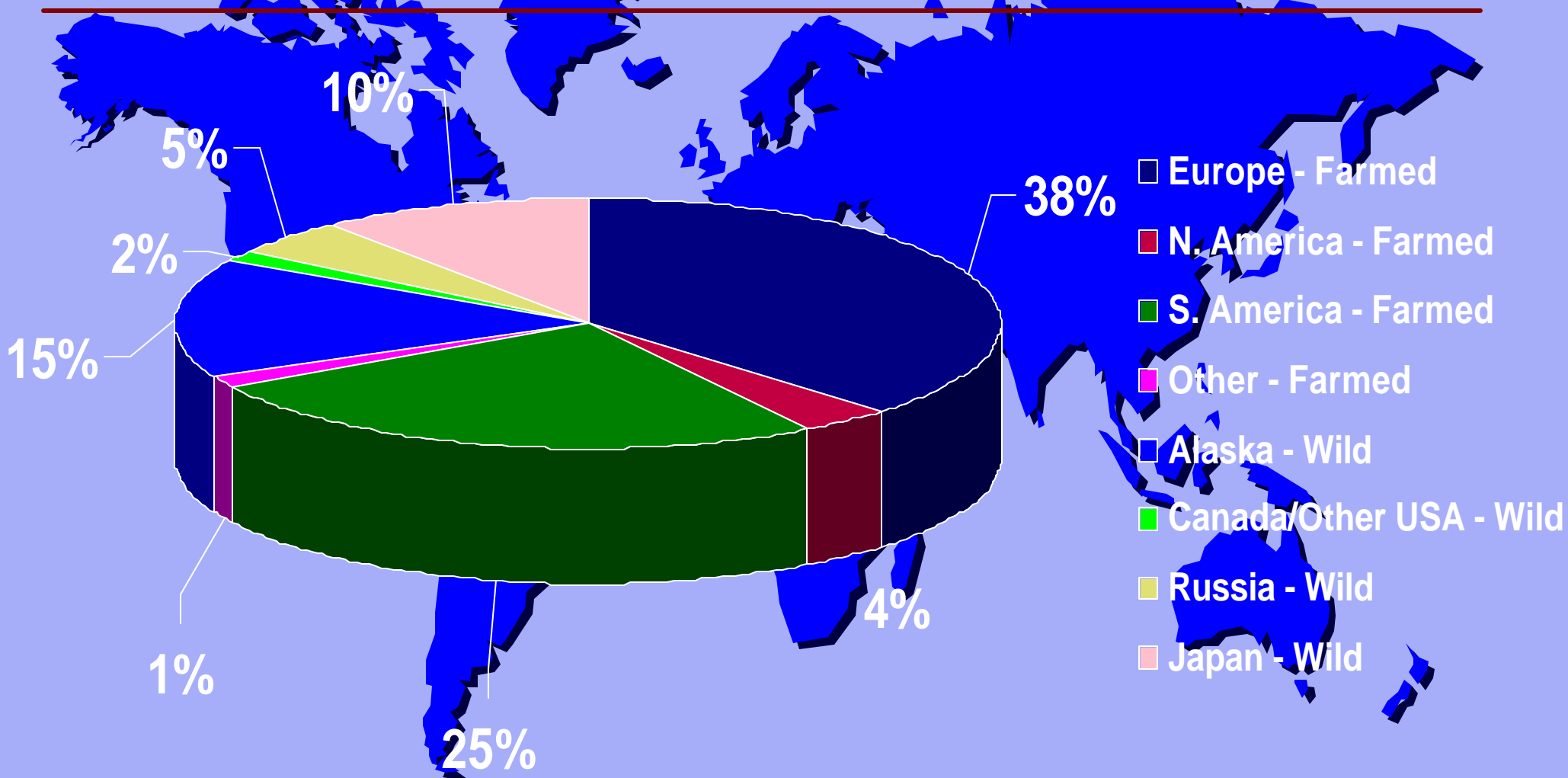

World Salmon & Trout Production during 2000-2004 by Farmed and Wild Production

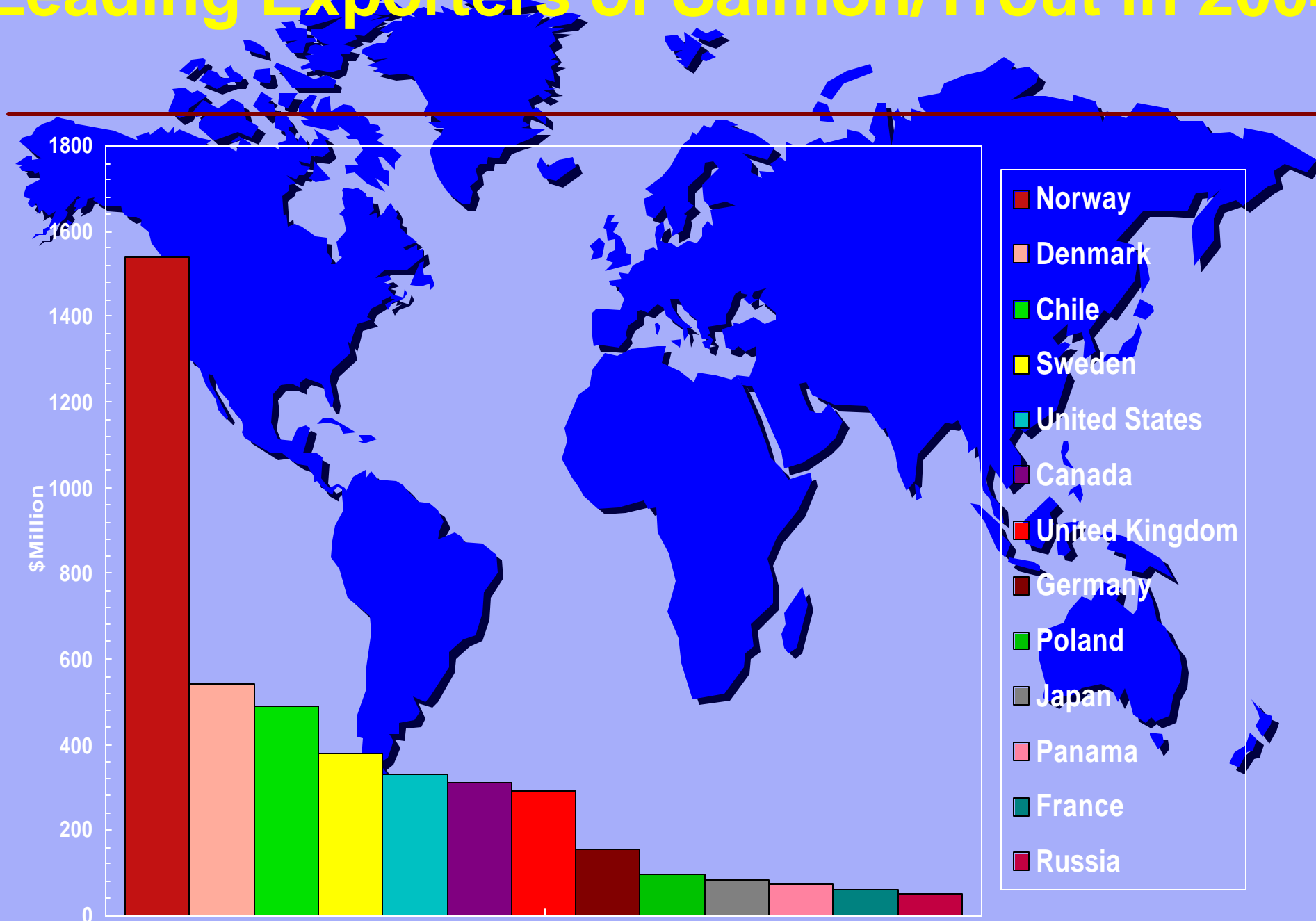


World Salmon & Trout Production Share by Source in 2004

Total: 2.4 million metric tons



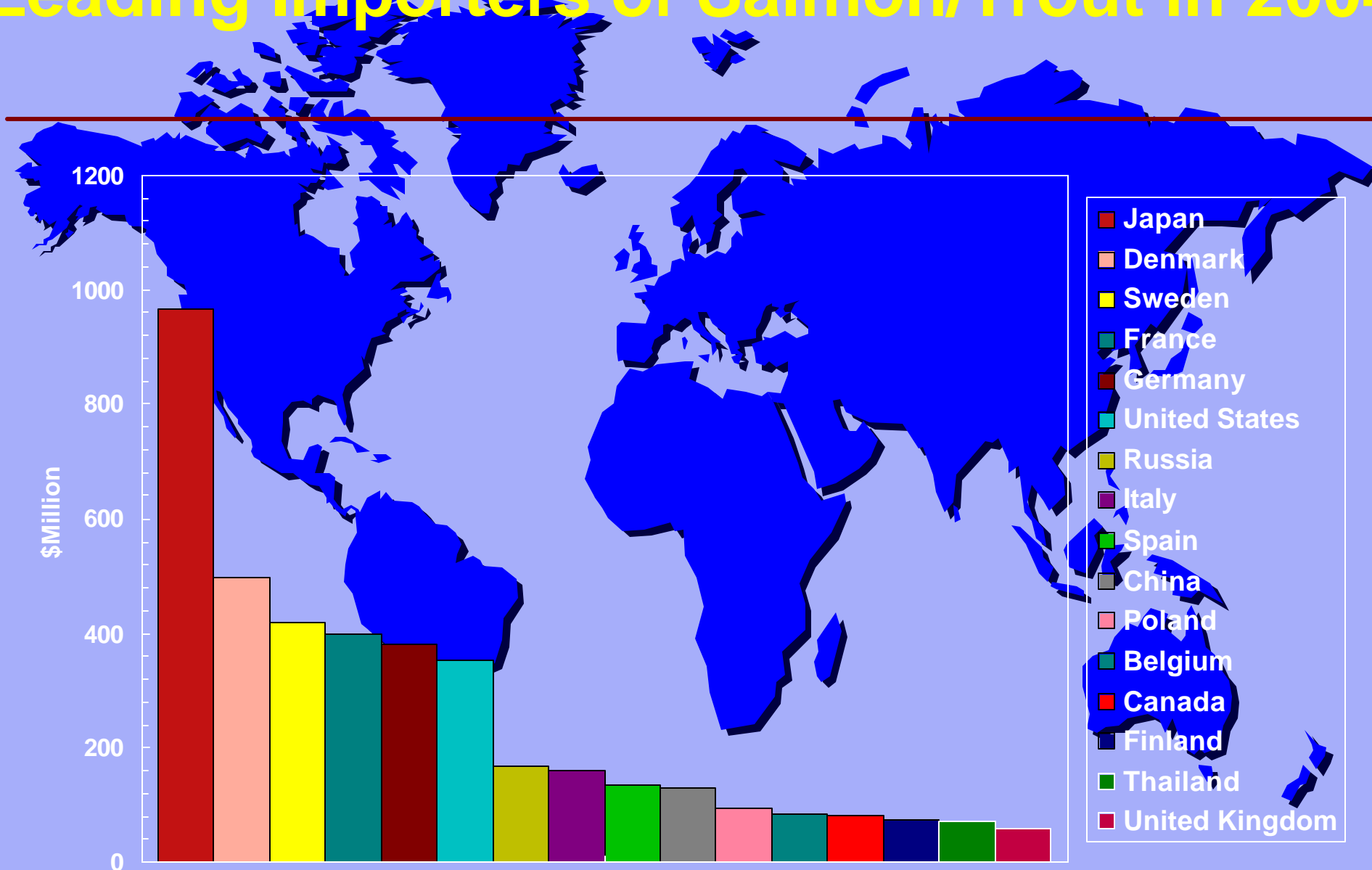
Leading Exporters of Salmon/Trout in 2004

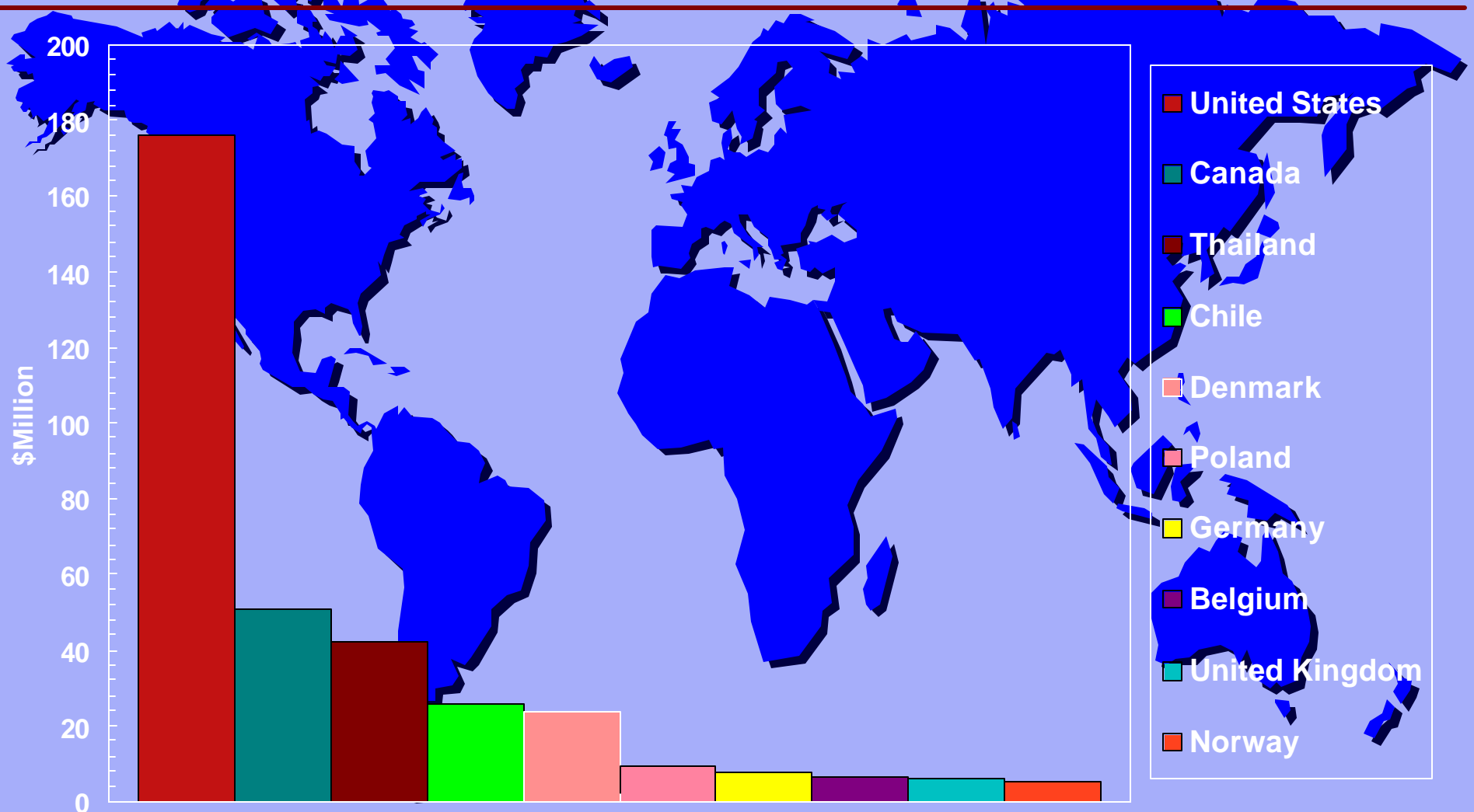
Leading Importers of Salmon/Trout in 2004
