1. The United States has been free from foot and mouth disease and swine vesicular disease for the past 2 years; it has been free from rinderpest, contagious bovine pleuropneumonia, lumpy skin disease, rift valley fever, for the past 3 years. There has not been any vaccination against any of the above diseases.
2. The beef was derived from cattle born and raised in the United States or from cattle imported from Mexico in accordance with U.S. import requirements and were resident in the United States for at least 100 days prior to slaughter.
3. The slaughter cattle were not suspect or confirmed BSE cases, or confirmed or suspect progenies or cohorts of BSE cases, as defined in the Terrestrial Animal Health Code adopted by the World Organization for Animal Health (OIE).
4. The slaughter cattle were determined to be less than 30 months of age according to documents which identify the age or by dentition.
5. The slaughter cattle in the establishments approved by the Korean government passed antemortem and postmortem inspection conducted by USDA veterinarians and were determined to be sound and healthy.
6. The slaughter cattle were not subjected to a stunning process, prior to slaughter, with a device injecting compressed air or gas into the cranial cavity, or to a pithing process.
7. The beef was processed in a manner to prevent contamination with specified risk material.
8. Sanitary packaging material was used to package the beef.
9. Based on the U.S. National Residue Program, the beef is free of harmful residues of antibiotics, heavy metals, pesticides, and hormones. The beef has not been irradiated or UV treated. Tenderizers have not been added.
10. The beef was produced according to the U.S. Pathogen Reduction/HACCP Systems Regulation.
11. The beef was produced, stored, and transported in a sanitary manner.
12. The beef was derived from cattle slaughtered in the United States.

GUIDELINE FOR COMPLETION OF FSIS FORM 9305-4, CERTIFICATE FOR EXPORT OF BEEF AND BEEF PRODUCTS TO THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA (ROK)

Certificate Number

Block 1. Enter the certificate number from FSIS Form 9060-5. Replacement of FSIS Form 9305-4 is required if an “In Lieu of” certificate has been issued so that the number in this block matches the certificate number of the export certificate accompanying the consignment.

Plant Data

Block 2. Slaughter plant official name, address and Est. number must be entered for all boneless beef.

Block 3. Cutting plant official name, address and Est. number must be entered for all boneless beef. If the boneless beef is cut at the slaughter plant, the information from block 2 should be repeated in this block.

Block 4. Cold Storage official plant name, address and Est. number is entered if product is moved to a cold storage warehouse other than a slaughter, processing or cutting plant. If a separate cold storage facility is not used, this block can be left blank.

Note: Official name (or official Doing Business As (DBA) name), address, and Est. number entries must exactly match the plant listing in the most current FSIS Meat and Poultry Inspection Directory or product will be detained by Korea. When a difference is determined, contact the FSIS Technical Service Center at (402) 344-5000.

Block 5. Slaughter dates are entered for all boneless beef.

Block 6. Processing, cutting or packing dates are entered.

Note: The date ranges entered must cover all dates stamped on containers and processing/pack dates obviously cannot precede slaughter dates. Slaughter and processing dates cannot be prior to September 11, 2006. Errors regarding slaughter/pack dates may result in detained and possible rejected shipments. FSIS personnel cannot provide assistance when this discrepancy is found.

Block 7 & 8. If the container number and commercial seal number are known at the time the product is certified for export, the exporter should indicate the numbers in block 14 on FSIS Form 9060-6, Application for Export Certificate. Also, the container number should be included in Block #7 and the seal number should be included in Block #8 of the FSIS 9305-4. If the container and seal number is not known at the time the product is certified for export: (1) the applicant completes FSIS Form 9060-6 entering the company name, contact person, address, and phone number of the company that will seal the container. FSIS will then verify the product is eligible for export and sign the 9060-6 in accordance with FSIS Directive 9000.1. FSIS will provide the FSIS Form 9060-5, Meat and Poultry Export Certificate of Wholesomeness, allow product to be stamped with the export stamp, perform export inspection, and allow shipment of the product without signing FSIS Form 9060-5, and the corresponding FSIS 9305-4 certificate, (2) The unsigned certificates are to be held by the original applicant. When the container and seal numbers are obtained, they should be presented to FSIS in block 14 of a revised 9060-6 and included in Block #7 and #8 of the FSIS 9305-4, (3) The applicant then requests signature of the revised FSIS Form 9060-6. FSIS Form 9060-5 and the corresponding FSIS 9305-4 certificate can then be signed by an FSIS veterinarian.

FSIS Signature

Block 9. Printed first name, M.I., and surname of FSIS signing official.

Block 10. Printed title or abbreviation (e.g., D.V.M.)

Block 11. Certifying official’s signature. Verification procedures related to EV programs described in FSIS Notice 19-06 must be completed prior to signature.

Block 12. Date of certifying official’s signature.

Note: The 9060-5 and 9305-4 must be signed by the same veterinarian.

Shipping Information

Blocks 13-17. Information provided and attested to by exporter/shipper.

Note: If errors are made in blocks 13-17, it will be necessary to obtain a replacement FSIS form 9305-4 completed and signed by the FSIS certifying official – then the correction can be made to the exporter/applicant blocks.
