SUBJECT: SUMMARY OF SCOPING MEETING HELD IN SUPPORT OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW FOR THE SURRY POWER STATION, UNITS 1 AND 2, LICENSE RENEWAL APPLICATION

On Wednesday, September 19, 2001, members of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) staff held public environmental scoping meetings in Surry, Virginia, in support of the staff's review of the application submitted by Virginia Electric and Power Company (Virginia Power, also referred to as Dominion) for renewal of the operating licenses for its Surry Power Station, Units 1 and 2 (Surry). Afternoon and evening sessions were held to allow maximum public participation. Formal presentations were made by Christopher Grimes and Andrew Kugler of the NRC staff. Attachment 1 is a corrected transcript for the afternoon meeting and Attachment 2 is a corrected transcript for the evening meeting. Attachment 3 is a copy of the presentation slides. Attachment 4 is a list of attendees for both the afternoon and evening sessions.

The purpose of the meetings was to provide the public with an opportunity to participate in the environmental scoping process by providing comments on any issues that it thought the NRC staff should consider while preparing a plant-specific supplement to the "Generic Environmental Impact Statement for License Renewal of Nuclear Plants" (NUREG-1437) for Surry. Each meeting was preceded by a 1-hour "open house" to allow members of the public to talk to the staff in a less formal setting. The staff presentations in the meetings outlined the overall license renewal process, provided a description of the National Environmental Policy Act review process, and addressed how these processes would be implemented during the Surry license renewal review.

After the formal presentations given by the NRC staff, members of the public were invited to provide comments. Officials from Virginia Power were also given the opportunity to address the audience and provide comments focusing on the environmental report that was submitted as part of the license renewal application. Approximately 70 people attended the two sessions with about 20 persons making comments. Attendees included representatives of the NRC, Virginia Power and nuclear industry; local government officials; a State agency official; special interest groups, and other members of the public.
