The following Bills of significance to NRCS and conservation have been introduced.

H. R. 3577	Gilchrest, MD	To reauthorize the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972.

THE SENATE RESUMES CONSIDERATION OF S. 1731 - On Wednesday, February 6, 2002 the Senate resumed consideration of S. 1731. A summary of activity is listed below. The Senate will continue considering amendments next week.

February 6, 2002

- Harkin Modified Amendment No. 2604 to apply the Packers and Stockyards Act, 1921, to livestock production contracts and to provide parties to the contract the right to discuss the contract with certain individuals. (Passed 82-14)
- Wellstone Modified Amendment No. 2602 to insert in the environmental quality incentives program provisions relating to confined livestock feeding operations and to a payment limitation. Would prohibit funding for CAFO's and operations located in a 100-year flood plain. (**Defeated 52 44**)
- Burns Modified Amendment No. 2607 to establish a per-farm limitation on land enrolled in the conservation reserve program. Would allow a farmer to re-enroll only 50 percent of their acreage in the conservation reserve program. (Withdrawn)
- Burns Modified Amendment No. 2608 to direct the Secretary of Agriculture to establish certain per-acre values for payments for different categories of land enrolled in the conservation reserve program. (Withdrawn)

February 7, 2002

- Durbin/Lugar Modified Amendment No. 2821 to prevent individuals illegally in the United States for more than a year from receiving food stamps. (Passed 96 1)
- Dorgan Amendment No. 2826 would reduce the maximum subsidy payment a farmer could receive to \$275,000. (Adopted by 66 31)
- Carnahan Amendment No. 2830 to permanently reenact the family farmer bankruptcy provisions (Chapter 12 of Title 11, United States Code). (Passed 93 0)
- Lugar Amendment No. 2827 complete rewrite of commodity program would reduce total cost from \$44 billion to \$25 billion. (**Defeated 85 -11**)

WATERSHED PROGRAM BUDGET – On Tuesday, February 6, 2002, NRCS staff provided a briefing to the House Transportation and Infrastructure, Subcommittee on Water Resources and Environment regarding the Administration's FY 2003 Budget relating to the Watershed Program. Committee staff asked numerous questions regarding the effect of eliminating funding for Watershed Operations as well as Surveys and Planning. Staff asked about the value of flood protection that the NRCS program backlog (\$1.6 Billion) would provide if the projects could be completed. The staff also inquired about the effect of terminating projects that have only been partially constructed as well as about technical problems associated with contract termination. The Committee requested additional details about the program backlog with data on a state-by-state basis.

AGRICULTURE NOMINATIONS CONFIRMATION HEARING- Senate Agriculture, Nutrition and Forestry Committee (Chairman Harkin, IA) will hold a confirmation hearing on pending nominations. Witnesses scheduled are Thomas Dorr to be under secretary of agriculture for rural development and Nancy Bryson to be general counsel for USDA.
