CONGRESSIONAL RESPONSE TO WEEKS TRAGIC EVENTS WITH

RESOLUTION/FUNDING – Following violent attacks this week on the World Trade Center in New York City, and the Pentagon in Washington, Congress unanimously passed a resolution authorizing the President "to use all necessary and appropriate force against those nations, organizations, or persons he determines planned, authorized, committed, or aided the terrorist attacks that occurred on September 11, 2001. The Congress also approved a financial aid package of \$40 billion for recovery efforts. The funding package includes \$10 billion in immediate aid to New York and Virginia for cleanup and recovery, \$10 billion to be released after a 15-day waiting period where Congress requires written notification from the President; and \$20 billion that can only be obligated after the President makes a specific request from Congress.
