LAST WEEK:

AGRICULTURAL POLICY- On September 19, 2001, Secretary Ann M. Veneman released the Administration's review of the food and agriculture system by identifying critical needs for the new century. The report, "Food and Agricultural Policy: Taking Stock for the New Century," details the changes that have taken place in agriculture.

An entire chapter is devoted to conservation. The report states seven principles for conservation;

- Sustain past environmental gains
- Accommodate new and emerging environmental concerns
- Design and adopt a portfolio approach to conservation policies
- Reaffirm market-oriented policies
- Coordinate conservation and farm policies
- Recognize the importance of collaboration

WETLANDS RESTORATION SUBCOMMITTEE HEARING - The Water

Resources and Environment Subcommittee (Chairman Duncan, TN) of the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee held a hearing on pending legislation that would establish a federal charter for wetland mitigation banks. The legislation is based on the 1995 Federal Guidance for the Establishment, Use and Operation of Mitigation Banks of which NRCS is a signatory. Witnesses included G. Tracy Mehan, III, Assistant Administrator for Water, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and Dominic Izzo, Principle Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Army, Army Corps of Engineers in addition to several environmental groups and operators of private mitigation banks. Committee Members were very supportive of the concept behind the legislation, but had many questions regarding the enforcement aspects and scientific basis to be used to establish and operate a wetland bank.
