Roger Allen Chipman

FALCON investigators arrested Roger Allen Chipman June 4 in Milwaukee, Wis. The Michigan Department of Corrections wanted Chipman for escape, after he walked away from a prison work detail in 1970. At the time of Chipman's escape, he had been serving a 5 to 10-year prison term for a 1968 conviction for indecent liberties with a minor. Once the U.S. Marshals adopted the case, FALCON investigators determined Chipman had assumed a false identity using the name Roger Allen Hansen. U.S. Marshals discovered that in 1978 authorities in Milwaukee arrested Chipman under this alias for sexual assault on a child, and again in 1995 for criminal sexual assault. Chipman registered as a sex offender using his alias. Acting on information obtained from the sex offender registry, FALCON investigators identified Chipman's location, responded to that site and took him into custody. While attempting to locate Chipman, investigators also developed information that he fraudulently obtained Social Security benefits. Chipman may face additional federal charges relating to those allegations.
