U.S. MARSHALS OPERATION

FALCON investigators arrested Kendrick June 19 in Indianapolis, Ind. An unidentified subject armed with a handgun robbed the Huntington Bank on North Post Road in Indianapolis April 22. During the commission of the robbery, the armed man fired a close-range shot at an employee of the bank, striking her in the stomach. The suspect then fled the scene on foot with an unknown amount of money. The bank teller, who was five-months pregnant with twins, was rushed to the hospital where doctors were unsuccessful in their attempts to save the children. The U.S. Marshals Task Force assisted the Indianapolis Metropolitan Police Department in their investigation. Acting on information developed by the Marion County Sheriff's Office, FALCON investigators identified and interviewed a subject. During the interview, Aaron Stewart admitted his role in the robbery and identified Brian Kendrick as the man who went into the bank and allegedly committed the crime. FALCON team members located several addresses and on the evening of June 19, Kendrick was taken into custody and charged with attempted murder, robbery, two counts of feticide, and possession of a handgun without a license. Stewart was charged with conspiracy to commit robbery.
