- Just before a bucket is completely full, dismantlers contact EQ to receive a replacement bucket.
- Once a bucket is full, dismantler can contact UPS for a pickup –a prepaid UPS label will be sent with every bucket.





National Vehicle Mercury Switch Recovery Program (NVMSRP)

What is the difference between ELVS and the NVMSRP?

- The NMVSRP is a voluntary multi-stakeholder, shared responsibility mercury switch collection program.
- ELVS is one of the signatories to the NVMSRP and has primary responsibility for education, collection materials, transportation, recycling, and record keeping.
- ECOS, ISRI, ARA, EPA, Steel, and NGOs make up the remainder of the NVMSRP partners and all have defined roles and responsibilities.
- Some states also have legislated requirements for some signatories and in some cases these may be identical to the responsibilities under the NVMSRP

National Vehicle Mercury Switch Recovery Program (NVMSRP) Goals

- Aggressive mercury recovery goals and performance metrics have been established. Performance will be regularly assessed by the participants.
- Nationwide implementation is targeted to occur over 12 months.
- In each state the parties will work collaboratively on an implementation plan.
- The NVMSRP will sunset in 2017 based on estimates that over 90% of the auto mercury switches will be retired.

National Vehicle Mercury Switch Recovery Program (NVMSRP) Process

 ELVS initiates contact with appropriate environmental state agency or affected recycling trade associations to determine status in the state and general timeline for moving forward.

or

- State agency and/or recycling associations and/or environmental groups **contact** ELVS indicating an interest in initiating the national program in their state
- 2. ELVS arranges initial meeting between NVMSRP team and interested stakeholders in the state to establish responsibilities and timing. Subsequent meetings are scheduled as needed.

National Vehicle Mercury Switch Recovery Program (NVMSRP) Process

- 3. State environmental agency and/or recycling associations develop list of recyclers operating in the state. Review process required to assure accuracy.
- 4. State agency sends a letter providing information on the NVMSRP to recyclers making them aware of program and advising them that they can request (or in some instances expect to receive) collection buckets.
- Collection buckets along with educational materials and additional information are distributed to recyclers.
- 6. Once a state has joined the program, any recycler in the state is able to request a collection bucket by contacting ELVS via the website, phone, or mail.
- 7. Stakeholders participate in on-going support and assessment of the program.
