Dear Mr. Cottschalk:

We have surveyed the Patent Office's administration of fees charged specific beneficiaries for services, giving particular attention to the establishment and review of fees as required by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circular A-25, and the Department's Administrative Order 203-5. We do not intend further review at this time; however, we wish to present our views on certain matters which we believe could be improved.

Need to establish responsibility
for review and setting of fees

We found that the Patent Office's formal delegations of authority for the review of fees were, in practice, never fully implemented and the Patent Office has no instructions on who is responsible for establishing and adjusting fees.

In 1960 the Commissioner of Patents formally assigned to the Budget Branch (now Office of Budget) by Administrative Order responsibility for conducting reviews of income and cost relationships and evaluating the adequacy and propriety of existing or proposed legislative and administrative fees. The 1967-1968 study of fees was made by the Office of Organization and Systems Analysis. According to the Director of that office, a former Assistant Commissioner for Administration gave him the authority to review user fees in an informal memorandum. A Departmental Organizational Order issued November 26, 1969, gave the duty to that office. Subsequent orders issued November 16, 1970, and May 4, 1971, did not mention user charge reviews. The December 11, 1972, order does not mention the subject either.

We were informed that a current study of fees—the first since 1967-1968—is being made by the Office of Finance in response to a verbal order by the Assistant Commissioner for Administration. They expect to finish the study by June 30, 1973.

We found that during the 1967-1968 review of fees, only 20 fees representing collections of \$1,330,209 of the 45 administratively-established fees were reviewed. The other 25 fees were not reviewed because collections for the fees totaling \$84,000 were considered to be relatively small. For the 20 fees reviewed, the computation showed that 11 of the fees were recovering less than cost and the other nine were recovering more than cost. (See enclosed schedule). Although OMB Circular A-25 requires that user charges recover costs as nearly as possible, only five of the 11 low fees and two of the nine high fees were adjusted subsequent to the review. We believe fee reviews should be conducted on an annual basis in the future as provided in OMB Circular A-25 and necessary adjustments made to the fee schedules to reflect review results.

Recommendations

Recognizing that the Patent Office is currently completing a review of fees, we recommend that the Patent Office (1) conduct its review of administratively-set fees annually in the future as provided by OMB Circular A-25 and adjust the fee schedules based on the review results, and (2) formally delegate responsibility for evaluation of the user charges including adjusting fee schedules to an appropriate office or offices.

We wish to acknowledge the courtesies and cooperation extended to our representatives during the survey. We would appreciate receiving information as to your action or views on the matters discussed in this letter.
