MORE THAN 25,000 PROFESSIONALS URGED TO TAKE ADVANTAGE OF ONLINE LICENSE RENEWAL PROGRAM

HONOLULU – The Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs (DCCA) has announced that 26,500 Hawaii professionals may now renew their licenses online at www.ehawaii.gov/pvlrenew. The program is a part of the highly successful effort by DCCA to implement efficient online filing procedures for businesses and professionals.

“Earlier this year, more than 60% of nurses and acupuncturists renewed their licenses online,” said DCCA Director Mark Recktenwald. “We hope for similar results this renewal cycle.”

Instructions for completing the online renewal have been mailed to each current license holder. Renewals for Emergency Medical Technicians, Physicians, and Podiatrists will be accepted until midnight on January 31, 2006. All other online renewals this cycle will be accepted until midnight on December 31, 2005. After that date, renewals will not be accepted online and persons wishing to renew their license must submit the forms by mail or in person to:

The development of this online service is a part of the Lingle-Aiona Administration's overall initiative to improve efficiency by implementing electronic government services. Currently ehawaii.gov has more than 33 online applications that residents, businesses and visitors may use to conduct business with the State via the Internet.

Hawaii's official Internet portal, ehawaii.gov, is managed by Hawaii Information Consortium, LLC (HIC). HIC works with state agencies to enable them to conduct state business online and improve public access to government information.
