Act 160

This report meets section 18.2, 2006 Session Laws of Hawaii (Budget Act), which states:

Provided that of the federal fund appropriation for environmental management (HTH 840) the sum of \$300,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, shall be expended by the department of health for the new online permitting and reporting project; provided further that the department shall prepare a progress report on the online permitting and reporting project that shall include a detailed timeline and cost breakdown from start up to projected completion and any accomplishments to date; and provided further that the department shall submit the report to the legislature no later than 20 days prior to the convening of the 2007 regular session.


EPA Environmental Information Exchange Grant Program

The goal of the National Environmental Information Exchange Program is to advance the Environmental Information Exchange Network (Exchange Network) and States' and other partners' data integration efforts. The Exchange Network is operational with about 45 states participating, now including Hawaii. Detailed information about the Exchange Network can be found at www.exchangenetwork.net.

The Environmental Health Administration (EHA) of the Hawaii Department of Health (DOH) was awarded a \$500,000 One Stop Grant under the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) One Stop Program to improve its information management practices. As discussed in the EPA Baseline Report on the EHA, prepared by Ross & Associates, three goals of EPA's One Stop Program are: "to reduce the burden of environmental reporting, to integrate information to support improved environmental management decision-making, and to enhance public access to environmental information." Grants awarded by EPA under the One Stop Program are intended to demonstrate real and successful innovations in best management practices of environmental information. One Stop Program grants are also intended to promote the exchange and use of environmental information between states and EPA.

DOH Implementation

Twelve initiatives have been identified to help EHA achieve its information management goals and were identified in the initial 2004 Five-Year Information Management Plan (Five-Year Plan), as shown below.



EHA completed both Phase 1 initiatives in 2004, completed one Phase 2 initiative in January 2006, and the remaining Phase 2 initiatives should be completed by June of 2007.

EHA adopted its Information Management Framework and hired its Environmental Information Manager in January 2006. EHA is in the final stages of implementing its pilot for permit streamlining and will follow with electronic permitting in the Wastewater Branch in collaboration with eHawaii.gov by June 2007. EHA also advanced development and completion of its EPA Network Node from phase 3 to phase 2 by taking advantage of a separate EPA grant award in October 2005. Early implementation of its Network Node lets EHA take advantage of the architecture for data sharing sooner for more data flows and meets EHA's grant commitment.

In November 2006, EHA amended its Five-Year-Plan to reflect actual developments and its latest analysis.
