ASIAN DEVELOPMENT BANK**



Curtis S. Chin was appointed Executive Director (with rank of Ambassador) in September 2006 of Asian Development Bank (ADB).

Ambassador Chin serves on the ADB's Board of Directors, which supervises the multi-lateral development bank's financial statements, approves its administrative budget, and reviews and approves policy documents and loan, equity, and technical assistance operations.

Established in 1966 with headquarters in Manila, the ADB is dedicated to reducing poverty through economic growth in the Asia-Pacific region, and has been involved in a range of post-disaster reconstruction and rebuilding efforts.

Prior to assuming his position at the ADB, Mr. Chin served as a managing director with Burson-Marsteller, an international public affairs firm, where he focused on crisis/issues management, corporate responsibility, stakeholder engagement and public-private sector partnerships. He has lived and worked throughout the United States and Asia, including in Beijing, Hong Kong and Tokyo. Ambassador Chin previously served on the U.S. Department of State's Advisory Committee on Cultural Diplomacy, and during the George H.W. Bush Administration served as Special Assistant to the U.S. Secretary of Commerce. The son of a career U.S. military officer, Ambassador Chin spent his youth in Bangkok, Taipei and Seoul as well as Arizona, Maryland and Virginia.
