CHAPTER 61

ANNUITIES FOR CERTAIN MILITARY SURVIVING SPOUSES (ACMSS)

6101 AUTHORITY

Public Law 105-85 (reference fu), provided temporary authority to pay certain military surviving spouses who were qualified surviving spouses effective December 1, 1997. Public Laws 106-65 and 107-314 provided permanent authority and technical amendments to ACMSS.

6102 ANNUITY APPLICATION

A qualified surviving spouse submits a claim, DD Form 2769 (Application for Annuity Certain Military Surviving Spouses), to the Military Service concerned. The Military Service reviews the claim and determines whether the applicant is qualified for an ACMSS annuity. If information is unavailable from existing records (such as DEERS (Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System)), the applicant may be required to submit the following documentation to the Military Service: certified copies of the member's death certificate, marriage certificate, DD Form 214 (Certificate of Release or Discharge From Active Duty), retirement order, retired pay statement, or any additional information needed to substantiate the claim. The Military Service notifies the applicant on the disposition of the claim within 60 days. The Military Service forwards approved claims to DFAS Cleveland Site for payment.

6103 <u>DEFINITION OF A QUALIFIED SURVIVING SPOUSE AND DECEASED</u> RETIRED MEMBER

- 610301. <u>Qualified Surviving Spouse</u>. A qualified surviving spouse is defined as a spouse who:
- A. Was married to a deceased retired member of a Uniformed Service described below at the time of such member's death and has never been remarried; and
- B. Was married to the member at the time the member became eligible for retired pay, or had been married to the member for at least one year before the date of death, or was the parent of a child born of such marriage.

610302. Deceased Retired Member. A deceased retired member is one who:

- A. Became entitled to retired pay or retainer pay before September 21, 1972, died before March 21, 1974, and was entitled to retired or retainer pay on the date of death, or
- B. Died before October 1, 1978, and at the time of death would have been entitled to retire pay under chapter 67 of title 10, United States Code [10 U.S.C. section 1331 et seq.] (as in effect before December 1, 1994), except for the fact that the member was under 60 years of age. The ACMSS under this subparagraph is payable for the months beginning after September 30, 1999.

6104 PAYMENT OF ANNUITY

- 610401. <u>Payment Effective Date.</u> Upon receipt of a validated claim endorsed by the Military Service, DFAS Cleveland shall begin payment to a qualified surviving spouse within 30 days. The monthly payments begin effective December 1, 1997, except where entitlement is under paragraph 610302.B above, in which case entitlement begins effective October 1, 1999.
- 610402. <u>Representative Payee</u>. ACMSS payments due to a mentally incompetent, or otherwise legally disabled person for whom a guardian or other fiduciary has not been appointed may be paid to a representative payee, as Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP). See paragraph 460103 of this volume.
- 610403. Report of Existence (ROE) and Certificate of Continued Eligibility (COE). The procedures for ROE and COE on SBP annuity payments also apply to ACMSS payments.
- 610404. <u>Debt Collection</u>. Overpayments of annuity are subject to the same collection action as SBP. See <u>Chapter 29</u> and <u>Chapter 47</u> of this volume.
- 610405. <u>Taxability</u>. The taxability of ACMSS payments is similar to SBP annuity. See Chapter 53 of this volume.
- 610406. <u>Death of Annuitant</u>. The annuity terminates the first day of the month in which the annuitant dies.
- 610407. <u>Arrears of Annuity</u>. Any amounts which are due and payable at the time of the annuitant's death may be paid in accordance with the provisions of section 3103. The unpaid annuity will only be paid upon receipt of a properly executed and documented claim, approved by the Secretary of the Service concerned (or designee).
- 610408. <u>Remarriage</u>. The annuity terminates the first day of the month in which the annuitant remarries.

6105 ANNUITY AMOUNT AND OFFSET

- 610501. <u>Amount</u>. The annuity to a qualified surviving spouse was initially established at \$165 per month. The amount is subject to the same cost-of-living adjustments and at the same time as military retired pay increases under 10 U.S.C. 1401a(b)(2). The first cost-of-living adjustment under 10 U.S.C. 1401a(b)(2) was effective December 1, 1997, as shown on Table 61-1. The provision for rounding monthly SBP annuity under 10 U.S.C. 1451(g)(2) is not applicable.
- 610502. Offset. The amount of annuity to which a surviving spouse is entitled under this section for any period shall be reduced (but not below zero) by any amount paid to the surviving spouse for the same period under any of the following provisions of law:

- A. Chapter 73, 10 U.S.C. (Survivor Benefit Plan; Retired Serviceman's Family Protection Plan; and Reserve Component Survivor Benefit Plan).
 - B. Section 4 of Public Law 92-425 (Minimum Income Widow's benefit).
 - C. Section 1311(a), 38 U.S.C. (Dependency and Indemnity Compensation.
- 610503. <u>Social Security Offset</u>. The social security offset does not apply to this section.

6106 <u>FUNDING</u>

Annuities must be funded by the approving Military Service from operation and maintenance funds for the fiscal year in which the payment is made.
